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1. Call to Order

c. NPSTC LMR LTE Integration and Interoperability Working Group

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Meeting Report

Chris Kindelspire gave a verbal summary of the National Public Safety Telecommunications Council (NPSTC) LMR LTE Working Group. Chris reported that the next Working Group call is scheduled for February 12. Chris also reported that the group is working on a document about Console interworking and they expect to complete this work in the March/April time frame.

d. PSTA (Public Safety Technology Alliance)

Randy Richmond gave a verbal update on the activities of the Public Safety Technology Alliance (PSTA). Randy reported that a proposal is being drafted for use of the DFSI to enable interworking of 3GPP MC services with analog FM LMR services. Something for TIA may be ready in the October time frame.

7. Old Business

None noted.

8. New Business

There was discussion of whether the P25 vocoder should be registered with the Internet Assigned Numbers Authority (IANA). This discussion was prompted by ETSI taking this action for the TETRA vocoder which may be used in end to end encrypted interworking LTE calls. The P25 vocoder is produced by DVSII. John Hardwick of DVSII participated in the discussion and agreed to gather more information on the subject.

9. Review of New Assignments

None noted.

10. Schedule Next Meeting

The chair noted that 30 minutes would be allocated to the schedule of the next face to face meeting the week of June 9 – 11 in Memphis, TN.

11. Adjourn
