## **TIA Meeting Report**

### **1. Call to order**

The meeting was called to order at 1:26 PM local time (EDT). The presiding Chair recorded the meeting notes.

### **2. Record attendance**

A list of attendees is attached. Roll was called. A quorum was determined to be present. The attendees were advised of the Important Notice of Participation which was included the Meeting Notice/Agenda. The chair also advised the attendees that TIA is actively seeking participation in projects from the user and general interest communities.

### **3. Review and approve agenda**

The chair distributed the agenda prior to this meeting. The agenda was also available in the TR-8.19 folder on the FTP site as *19-021 TR-8.19 Meeting Notice-Agenda Oct 2019.pdf*. Mr. Dwight Smith moved to approve the agenda as written and Mr. Jim Eastwood seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

### **4. Review and Approve Last Meeting Report**

The meeting report from TR8.19's June meeting in Des Moines was available in the TR-8.19 folder as *19-011 TR-8.19\_Meeting\_2019\_06\_18\_Meeting\_Report.pdf*. Mr. Dwight Smith made a motion to approve the meeting notes and Mr. Jim Eastwood seconded the motion; there was no discussion and the motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

### **5. TIA IPR Policy**

The TIA patent policy was read earlier in the day by Mr. John Lambrou:

“TIA's Intellectual Property Rights Policy can be found in Statements of Policy (ANNEX D) and other clauses and annexes of this document. Participants in the work of the TIA Formulating Groups are urged to review the appropriate sections. Individual participants are encouraged to notify TIA of any patent(s) or published pending patent application(s) of which they are aware that may be essential to the practice of a proposed TIA Publication, including requirements

introduced through normative references, early on in the development to reduce the possibility for delays in the development process and increase the likelihood that the proposed TIA Publication will become a Standard. However, a Patent Holder who has provided TIA with a TIA Patent Holder Statement with respect to the applicable proposed TIA Publication need not (but may elect to) identify its specific patent(s) or published pending patent application(s) that may be essential to the practice of the proposed TIA Publication in question. Patent searches are not required to comply with the TIA Intellectual Property Rights Policy.”

### **INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS (early disclosure policy)**

“TIA has an Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Policy. We call to the attention of participants and attendees that TIA’s Policy is to encourage, but not require, the voluntary disclosure (preferably early) of Essential Patent(s) and published pending patent application(s) that may be essential to the practice of a TIA Publication. Such disclosures are to be made following the procedures of the TIA Intellectual Property Rights Policy. Additional information can be found in the TIA Intellectual Property Rights Guidelines.”

The chair asked the question “is there knowledge of patents, the use of which may be essential to any standard being considered here?” No IPR was identified.

## **6. Old Business / Status Report**

The chair provided the working group’s status review using slide deck *19-027 TR-8.19 October 2019 Status Review.pptx*.

The chair reviewed TR-8.19’s activity since the June meeting in Des Moines. There were working group calls which were held on August 7, September 4, and October 2. The calls were used to review and perform comment resolution on the draft TIA-102.BACA-B IWF Addendum.

### **a. Disposition of TIA-PN-102.BACG ISSI Messages and Procedures for Group Regrouping**

The chair indicated that Motorola Solutions is developing the first draft. The latest documents were available in the BACG folder. The chair indicated that work is stalled in order to progress the IWF Addendum.

### **b. Disposition of TIA-102.CACD-D ISSI Interoperability Test Procedures for Trunked Voice Operation Involving the ISSI**

The chair indicated that there is an editorial board comment matrix for this document and it was available in the CACD-D folder as 19-004. The matrix is for new issues identified since publication. The chair said Motorola has entered two issues which were identified based on questions from Mr. Chris Wilson.

The chair indicated that DHS CAP established a comment period on a draft ISSI CSSI Interoperability Test Case CAB which references the TIA-102.CACD-D test cases. The comment period closed on July 19 and a comment matrix has not yet been published. The chair said he will wait to see if the DHS CAP comment period identifies additional TIA-102.CACD-D comments prior to acting on the TR-8.19 comment matrix 19-004.

### **c. Document Progress Tracking**

The chair provided the document progress tracking update slide deck  
*19-010 ISSI\_Wireline\_and\_Air\_Interface\_documents\_progress\_status\_June\_2019.pptx*.  
The slides indicated that there were no changes since February of 2019.

d. Future Work Outlook

Future work in TR8.19 is expected on:

- The IWF Addendum
- Group Regrouping Messages and Procedures
- Group Regrouping Addendums
- ISSI Interoperability Erratum Addendum to fix errors
- ISSI Supplementary Data Interoperability from ISSITG

**7. New Business**

- a. Consideration of opening a project for TIA-102.BACA-B-3 *ISSI Messages and Procedures for Voice Services, Mobility Management, and RFSS Capability Polling Services – Addendum 3 – Interworking with an IWF*

The Chair summarized the ATIS WTSC/TIA TR-8 Joint Land Mobile Radio to Long-Term-Evolution (JLMRLTE) documents which were available in the TR-8.8 Charlotte folder:

- TR8.8-19-011\_WTSC-JLMRLTE-2019-00038R002 – Liaison from WTSC to TR-8 regarding phase 1 completion of the JLMRLTE interworking architecture study
- TR8.8-19-012\_WTSC-JLMRLTE-2019-00028R001 -May 9 JLMRLTE meeting notes which contains a description of the phase 1 scope of the Interworking Study document
- TR-8.8-19-013 WTSC-JLMRLTE-2019-00001R006 – the version of the Interworking Study document provided with the Liaison statement to Tia

The chair indicated TR-8.19 has started to enhance TIA-102.BACA-B to enable interworking for the services defined in Phase 1 of the JLMRLTE study. The services are:

- Group registration
- Group de-registration
- Group call (non-emergency and emergency)
- Announcement group call
- Broadcast group call
- Manual key management (no ISSI work)

The chair indicated the approach agreed to during the August 7 working group call is to create a new addendum which adds a normative annex that explains, for the services supported by phase 1 of the JLMRLTE Study, how specific sections of BACA-B (and its addendums) apply when one of the RFSSs is an IWF.

The chair indicated work on the normative annex is in progress, Rev 3 of the draft (19-022) and the combined comment matrix on Rev 2 of the draft (19-019-R2) were provided in the IWF Addendum folder on the FTP site.

The chair asked for a motion to open project TIA-102.BACA-B-3 *ISSI Messages and Procedures for Voice Services, Mobility Management, and RFSS Capability Polling Services – Addendum 3 – Interworking with an IWF*, Mr. Jim Downes so moved and Mr. Dwight Smith seconded the motion to open the project. There was no discussion and the motion passed unanimously by voice vote. The chair took an action item to request that the project be opened.

The chair then indicated that Motorola has authored a draft Liaison statement to JLMRLTE regarding issues that have been identified during the development of the TIA-102.BACA-B IWF Addendum based on the content of the JLMRLTE Phase 1 Study.

The draft Liaison asks for architectural guidance when there are multiple simultaneous audio sources in a single call. The Liaison also included two points for JLMRLTE consideration only.

The chair said draft Rev 01 of the Liaison was distributed September 28 and comments were received from FirstNet. The comments were resolved during the working group call on October 2 and the draft Liaison was revised for the comment resolutions. The FirstNet comment matrix was on the FTP site as 19-025-R1 and the revised draft Liaison statement was on the FTP site as 19-023-R1. The chair asked if there was consensus to send the Liaison (19-023-R1) to JLMRLTE. No members disagreed with sending the Liaison to JLMRLTE. The chair took an action item to forward the Liaison statement to JLMRLTE.

There was no other new business.

## **8. Review of current Assignments**

- a. The chair will request a project be started, TIA-102.BACA-B-3 *ISSI Messages and Procedures for Voice Services, Mobility Management, and RFSS Capability Polling Services – Addendum 3 – Interworking with an IWF*.
- b. The chair will forward the Liaison statement (19-023-R1) to JLMRLTE.
- c. Motorola Solutions is drafting the IWF Addendum (the new project TIA-102.BACA-B-3)
- d. Motorola Solutions is drafting the *ISSI the Group Regrouping Messages and Procedures*.

## **9. Schedule next meeting**

The next face-to-face meeting will be sometime after the new year. The chair asked for 30 minutes. TR-8.19.1 working group calls will continue as required from 10:00 am to 12:00 PM CDT.

## **10. Adjournment**

Mr. John Lambrou made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Mr. Dwight Smith seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote. The meeting was adjourned at 1:46 PM local time (CDT).
